The **GAMC** is happy to confirm a guided tour on former **O'Brien Barracks** in Schwabach. **The City of Schwabach** - once part of the **Nuernberg US-Army Military Community** – hosted American soldiers for 47 years before the total closure of the Schwabach military facilities in May 1992. O'Brien was home for the 1st Squadron, 1st Regiment Cavalry (1/1 Cav) and 2nd Battalion, 52nd Air Defense Artillery Brigade.



In the course of a guided tour we will be able to see what has become of O'Brien Barracks after 23 years. Many buildings still remind of the Americans while others have been completely renovated. GAMC-President, Marco Froemter, will take you back in time with stories, pictures and a nice walking tour "on post".



After the tour the City of Schwabach offers an exclusive look behind the curtain to have an authentic look at the skilled crafts of a gold-beater. After the demonstration there is plenty of time to see the Museum about the history of the City of Schwabach (including the history of the US-Army). The entrance fee (one person) for the museum is 5 Euro. The tour itself is free!
